## PASTOR'S PIECE - Rev. Cara Davis



I am delighted to be invited to minister along side of you bridging the time between Rev. Dr. Jay Terbush and your new settled pastor (coming soon...) Many of you know me as a longtime member of your church, but others of you may be new. So let me introduce myself.
Since arriving in the Berkshires in 1971 I have lived in Lee, Stockbridge and currently in Great Barrington. I joined this church sometime in the " 80 s, was graciously supported while "in care" (going to seminary) and was ordained in this church in 1990 with my first call to a small church in North Pomfret, Vermont.

After two small churches, both of which were a significant commute, I decided parish ministry was not for me and went to work, with people who are unstably housed, at Construct Inc in Great Barrington. Together with volunteers from the community and a dynamic Board of Directors we developed an emergency fund, a transitional shelter and affordable housing in the southern Berkshires. This generous congregation has supported Construct since the late '80s, if not since its inception in 1969, for which I am most grateful. Lee Congregational has been a major donor that allowed Construct to develop a supportive housing project called Genesis House for people who are often unsuccessful in housing for one reason or another and want to begin again.

After retiring from Construct 6 years ago, I came to Lee as your Sabbatical Minister for three months while Rev. Bill Neil was away. This experience then propelled me into Great Barrington Congregational Church as their Bridge Minister for eight months where together we prepared for a warm welcoming of their new pastor. Most recently I completed a three-year Designated Term as minister of First Church of Christ in Pittsfield. Our work together included seeking a reuse of their building and ultimately putting the building on the market while they explored consolidating with South Congregational to form one unified UCC presence in Pittsfield. While it was heartbreaking to let go of a beautiful and historical building, it was also quite exciting (and challenging) to found something altogether new with friends in Christ.

My passions include (in no particular order) contemplative prayer and action for economic, racial, and environmental justice, my children and grandchildren, my extended families, and of course my dogs, Sula and Pi, from whom you will hear if we Zoom. And how can I not add, the natural world around us and beauty of the Berkshires. All of which is to say: I come to you as a grateful and longtime friend, minister and former member of this church, excited to bridge this time with you.
