Some Resources for Understanding the Israel-Palestine War From Pastor Marisa

First: I'll be taking a web-based certification course throughout the month of February. It's called "Peacebuilding Amid Polarization: A Leader's Toolkit for Constructive Engagement on the Israeli-Palestinian Crisis" sponsored by Hartford International University for Religion and Peace, Sharing Sacred Spaces and Religions for Peace USA. It'll meet weekly on Thursdays by zoom, with a distinguished faculty, engaging us on topics like detoxifying the discourse, deep listening, pathways

HOLY WEEK 2024

March 24, Palm Sunday 10:30am Worship –

Join us for a parade of palms and celebratory singing to welcome Jesus to Jerusalem, along with a baptism for one of our families! We will then shift to a more contemplative second half, pointing at the tests and trials of Holy Week that lead us to the Last Supper and the Cross.

March 28, Maundy Thursday 7:00pm Service of Shadow & Light

The Deacons lead us in sharing a re-enactment of the Passover night when Jesus sat with his friends and instituted the Sacrament of Communion, followed by a Tenebrae service of scripture and candlelight to walk us through the events of that night that led to Jesus' arrest and trial.

March 29, Good Friday Vigil 12-3pm in the Sanctuary

Join Pastor Marisa for a time of sitting with Jesus at the cross – with devotions, scripture, song and poetry at every quarter hour, and silence in between for sacred reading or meditation.

March 31, Easter Sunday

6:00am Easter Sunrise Service in the Church Park -

We will follow the disciples going to the tomb on Easter morning in sorrow, finding it empty and encountering the risen Christ! A simple service of monologues, scripture and music out in the park as the sun rises!

10:30am Easter Sunday Service in the Sanctuary -

We celebrate with hymns of joy and sacred text telling of Jesus' triumph over death and sorrow, arising and equipping those who follow with the good news of the Gospel: He is risen! He is risen, indeed!

From the Music Director

Well, to say this has been a "whirlwind" 2 months here at the Lee Congregational Church would be an understatement. I have to admit that my the past 55 years, with many, many Pastoral changes, this one "takes the cake"! (Never really knew what that expression means? There was no cake?) However, thanks to our amazing new Pastor and your dedicated staff and support groups within this church, it has been basically "seamless".

I think it is safe to say that the pandemic of 2020 has caused us more problems than we thought possible. But we have met our obligations to the best of our knowledge, with some hiccups along the way, which was expected. I have learned a lot in this short period especially regarding the rules of copyright. But I still have much more to learn. We also are working on making our on-line services as good as they can be. Again, it has been a learning process. Our struggle remains getting the best sound in the sanctuary without compromising the sound on the video stream. And vice-versa. I can tell you that we have not had great success thus far, but we do have a plan moving forward that will require the help from a few people outside this congregation. It would be very easy to say that we should just go back to doing what we did best before Covid, but that would be short-sighted and

not be in the best interest of this church in the years to come. I do not know what the future holds, but I do know that it will definitely be dependent on computers and our ability to utilize them. I truly do not believe that anyone reading this newsletter over the age of 60 even begins to understand how "artificial intelligence" will change the way everything is done by our grandchildren. Think about the fact that the Wrights Brothers' first powered airplane flew at Kitty Hawk, North Carolina, on December 17, 1903, making a 12second flight, traveling 36 meters (120 ft), with Orville piloting. Apollo 11 (July 16–24, 1969) was the American spaceflight that *first landed* humans on the Moon, with Commander Neil Armstrong and Lunar Module Pilot Buzz Aldrin. It only took 66 years to go from a 12-second flight to landing on the moon and getting back safely. Artificial Intelligence is not new, and will not be going away, but it will change everything, including how we do church. Just a week ago, I had the privilege of participating in a funeral service honoring my friend David Stone, along with some other very talented musicians. But the climax of the service was listening to the song David composed on his computer which was later turned into a MIDI file and stored on our revamped pipe organ. The song is called "Proclaim" and it is amazing. But this was not possible 20 years ago. Everything changes over time.

When I came to this church a mere 13 years ago, I never thought for a minute that during my time here we would be dealing with the issues of today. But we are, and I will do my very best to help bring the music program in this church into 2024. It won't be easy, and it won't be without some costs, but it will be done. And I truly believe that we have the right leader at the right time to make sure that happens.

Sexton Changes

As far as a replacement for Jason, the F&F committee has reached out to Glenn Withers, our previous Sexton. Garth and I met with him and have reached an agreement for him to come back to do the interior cleaning of the church. He was able to start work on Monday, January 29th. So that's great news. As far as the outside snow shoveling is concerned, we have reached an agreement with Gary O'Brien Property Services, who does our driveway plowing, to clear all the walkways, steps and handicap ramp. However, keep in mind that the walkway clearing will be done after the snow event stops, and they are done with all of their plowing commitments.
