# Pastor's Piece Dear Friends,

This month spans most of our Lenten time together – when winter sometimes roars back but so many days are warmer and you can smell the return of spring! I know the bulbs in my front yard think so . . . it is a good time for being quieter, like the trees, regrouping our energy within and building up our strength and resources, attending to what we need to release or renew to become the Easter people Christ calls us to be.

Like the trees, in community we are connected and can share our resources, our sustenance, our hope among our root system of church community and help each other revitalize. Winter means underground rebuilding, as does Lent, and as we get towards the final weeks of March we are, like the buds and bulbs, ready to burst forth into the power of Holy Week and the joy of Easter morning!

We have many ways to walk together these weeks of March – and I hope you find a place for yourself in them:

**Palm Sunday**, March 24 10:30am Worship with Palms and the joy of...A baptism! Then we transition into the more sobering events of Holy Week

Maundy Thursday, March 28 7pm A service of Light and Shadow with Communion and Tenebrae. Come early for a special tender prelude from the Eagles Community Trombone Ensemble from 6:45-7pm in the Sanctuary!

Good Friday, March 29 12 – 3pm Vigil of Our Lord Come companion Jesus on the cross with prayer services on the hour of 12, 1 and 2, and devotions with scripture, poetry, hymn and silent observance at the quarter hours.

# Easter Sunday, March 31

6:00am in the Church Park - Sunrise Service!

Join us and the first disciples at the tomb in a brief service of scripture and song as the sun rises, and we are the first to see that He is Risen!

10:30am Worship in the Sanctuary – with Choir & Joyous Music!

We greet the new day of our redeeming – He is Risen, He is Risen Indeed!

Easter Egg Hunt following the service.

### **HOLY WEEK 2024**

# March 24 Palm Sunday 10:30am Worship

We start with a parade of palms to welcome Jesus to Jerusalem, then a contemplative second half shifts us to the trials of Holy Week.

# March 28 Maundy Thursday 7:00pm Service of Shadow & Light

The Deacons lead us in a re-enactment of the Passover night when Jesus instituted the Sacrament of Communion, followed by a Tenebrae service of scripture and candlelight to walk us through the events that led to Jesus' arrest and trial.

## March 29 Good Friday Vigil 12-3pm

Come for any part of this vigil to sit with Jesus at the cross – with devotions, scripture, song and poetry every quarter hour, and silence in between for sacred reading or meditation.

# March 31 Easter Sunday

**6:00am Easter Sunrise Service in the Church Park** – we will follow the disciples going to the tomb on Easter morning in sorrow, and encountering the risen Christ! A simple service of monologues, scripture and music out in the park as the sun rises!

10:30am Easter Sunday Service in the Sanctuary – we celebrate with hymns of joy and sacred text telling of Jesus' triumph over death and sorrow, arising and equipping those who follow with the good news of the Gospel: He is risen! He is risen, indeed!

# **One Great Hour of Sharing**

Every Lent, the United Church of Christ, and many other mainline denominations, take up a special collection for World Mission. The UCC calls this offering the *One Great Hour of Sharing* which is at work all year round. This special mission offering involves you in disaster, refugee/immigration and development ministries throughout the world. When people are displaced, you are part of the response and recovery, helping to provide relief to the most vulnerable.

Collection will take place on Sunday, March 10<sup>th</sup> and giving envelopes will be available that day. Checks may be made out to the church with OGHS in the memo.



# **Heifer International**

This is the time of our annual collection for Heifer International, a global outreach organization aiding those in poverty.

Examples of what can be purchased include:

- ·\$120 goat Source of milk and meat, clears the land
- ·\$30 beehive Honey can be sold
- •\$20 flock of chicks Source of meat and eggs, which can be sold
- •\$275 send a girl to school ... In many places, it is almost impossible for a girl to go to school

# A Note from the Music Director

# From the Music Director

We have entered the season of Lent, some of the most solemn weeks of the Church calendar. Until the pandemic, I was always

away for my 4 weeks during Lent, and thankfully I had Dorothy to fill in and do a great job. I have always understood the meaning of Lent and how important it is in our Christian faith, and why the music for Lent is also important, but it has never been my favorite season in church. The good news is that I have Palm Sunday and Easter to look forward to. And they are two of my favorite Sundays of the year. And I am a patient person.

There are still a lot of changes going on at the church. They are all good changes and necessary. "Live Streaming" changed our world here in the church, and I think we are all doing a good job catching up with the new challenges, regulations and rules. We are taking our lead from Marisa, since she is the most knowledgeable and makes a great leader. The new microphones that the church purchased are working out very well. They should serve this church for many, many years to come. These new wireless mics allowed us to remove all of the mic cables from the altar. The cables are still connected into the 'snake' for the time being and can still be used if we have a problem. John and Tim did a great job running those cables underneath the pew next to the piano. That left me with a lot of mic cable that we are not using, along with 6 Shure SM58 mics that the church owns. A big thank you to Nate for taking two 50-foot cables and two 25-foot cables and running them for me from the Pipe Organ down to the sound board while at the same time making them almost invisible. Great job Nate. So now we have 2 "wired" mics in the organ loft eliminating the need to use two Earth Angels wireless mics every Sunday. I plan to discuss with the church the possibility of using another one of our Shure 58s for the piano mic. Both the Pipe Organ mics and the Piano mics are "muted" in the sanctuary, but necessary for the folks watching at home to hear them.

So thank you all for your patience with the changes that are being made to the music program. It is a "work-in-progress" but we have made significant improvements already, and more to come. I also want to thank the church for having my

friend Bruce Clapper spend some time with us to improve the quality of the sound both here in the sanctuary and in people's living rooms. Since that weekend I have heard nothing but good remarks regarding the improvement. Please know that you have a good team in this church trying to do whatever it takes to improve. Until next month, just waiting for Easter!
