A MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR

In May we especially bless those who bring the presence of mothering to our lives:

My friends and family at Lee Church! I greet you with joy at the ever-blossoming spring that is all around us, the warmer days, the scent of flowers, the gold of forsythia . . . such a reminder that nature reflects to us always the hope that the sun will rise again after night, that spring blooms again after winter, that even when life may seem sparse and harsh, the earth keeps turning and a new day comes. We have so much happening in our community and our church in May and June – I want to touch on some of them and highlight them to us all:

## BERKSHIRE INTERFAITH ORGANIZING NEWS

There are two teams on BIO, the Transportation Team, that I am on, and the Housing Team. The Housing Team is dealing with landlords around the county that plan to raise monthly payments by large amounts. There is one complex in Pittsfield that hopes to raise its rent by 230%.

BIO may be joining some kind of visible opposition to this maneuver. There is a rent control committee for Pittsfield that is also dealing with these issues and they may need our support. The specifics follow below, but I should also say that the meeting to discuss these issues was on April 3<sup>rd</sup>, when the storm came upon us and knocked out Spectrum! So the meetings have been rescheduled.

Two mobile home parks are facing proposed rent increases that range from 29% to 230% more than current rates. In Pittsfield, Lake Onota Village residents are fighting a 29% rent increase proposed by landowners M.H. Communities LTD. In West Stockbridge, Thomas F. Lennon of Lennon Capital Group is proposing a 230% rent increase at the Residences on Mill Pond. Without diving into the details, I cannot overemphasize how important it is to preserve affordable regional options for housing, such as these mobile home parks. There are human beings whose lives may be seriously disrupted if these increases pass at the level the owners are proposing.

Luckily, tenants have a defense mechanism in both municipalities. Both Pittsfield and West Stockbridge have Mobile Home Park Rent Control Boards which must approve/disapprove any changes in rent - and both boards are meeting publicly this week to continue deliberating.
